CITY OF ELKHORN ORDINANCE NO. 19-08

An Ordinance to amend Chapter 13 of the Elkhorn Municipal Code

WHEREAS such changes shall not be enforced until April 1, 2020

BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council that the Elkhorn Municipal Code is hereby amended at Chapter 13 as follows:

Chapter 13.4.040 shall be retitled to: Sump Pump and Clear Water Discharge;

Sections of 13.4.040 are hereby amended as follows:

- (1) Existing Buildings. Sump pumps shall be connected to existing storm sewers, laterals or storm sewer catch basins when said storm sewers systems are within subject parcel frontage and out of the roadway, unless after inspection the City has determined that a connection at the specific location is not reasonably feasible (driveway crossing, utility conflict, etc.).
- (2) New construction of Buildings. When constructing a new building, sump pumps shall be connected to the storm sewer system within 6 months from the date of completion of construction.
- (6) Sump Pump Discharges Which Form a Public Nuisance. Under permissible circumstances that sump pumps are not connected to a storm sewer system as derived under Subsection 13.4.040 (1) overland discharge over hard surfaces (sidewalks, driveways & roadways) is permitted between April 1st to November 1st; overland discharge to terrace areas (grass surfaces) will be permitted year round. During specified timeframes where overland discharge is permissible it must not create a Public Nuisance as it relates to freezing or slippery conditions within public right-of-way over sidewalks or within the roadway.
- (7) Sump pump piping from the building or home to the public storm sewer, laterals or storm sewer catch basins shall be the responsibility of the property owner, including the connection to the public sewer.

Re: Babe Mann Park Fundraising Opportunity

As we begin the planning stages for Phase 1 of Babe Mann Park, I began brainstorming ways to increase community involvement and funding for Babe Mann Improvements. I believe the City should produce an engraved brick fundraiser to generate interest and increase funding. Below is the cost breakdown for the program through *That's My Brick*:

| Brick Type | Product Cost | Funder Cost | Contribution |
|------------|--------------|-------------|--------------|
| 4x8 Brick | \$17-\$22 | \$50 | \$28-\$33 |
| 8x8 Brick | \$31-\$40 | \$100 | \$60-\$69 |

^{*}These prices include the cost of brick, engraving and shipping. Prices vary on total amount ordered*

We would place the bricks on the wall of the new park shelter or on ground surrounding the park shelter. If council decides to pursue this fundraiser, it is my recommendation that we offer this program from December of 2019 – August of 2020 to maximize our donations. At the end of August, we would then place our order of engraved bricks and install them in the Fall of 2020.

Re: Babe Mann Park Grants

As we begin the planning stages for Phase 1 of the Babe Mann Park, I began researching additional funding opportunities outside of the \$350,000 city council has budgeted for 2020. Currently, the Land and Water conservation fund (LWCF) has an ongoing stewardship program that has received over \$218 million dollars of funding over the last five decades for projects such as Babe Mann Park. In order to apply for these programs, the City of Elkhorn must have a Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan (CORP), unfortunately ours was last updated in 2011 and expired in 2015. I strongly believe that having an updated CORP for the City of Elkhorn would benefit the Babe Mann Park project greatly along with all parks in the City of Elkhorn for years to come. In order to have an effective CORP, the City of Elkhorn would need to hire an outside agency to put the plan together. Below are two price ranges for an updated CORP:

Teska \$20,000 - \$25,000

Ayres \$15,000 - \$20,000

It is my recommendation the city uses some funds allotted for Babe Mann Park in 2020 to update the Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan. By doing so, we will have a completed plan for the next 5 years that will allow us to apply for these programs and benefit our parks for years to come. Teska put together our current Babe Mann Park master plan and are willing to work with us on the CORP process.

Summary: Associated Bank has submitted a proposal to continue providing Banking Services for the City for a like term of 4 years.

They will continue under the favorable terms agreed to 4 years ago and their customer service which cannot be rated on paper has been outstanding as both Jessie Bartmann and Corrie Daly, the two employees that deal with them on a daily basis, will attest.

Some examples of their customer service:

- 1) When we started with Associated Bank we had to purchase 2 scanners for scanning checks and these cost \$700.00/each. In a rather joking manner I told Jessie to ask them to throw those in for a new customer. They actually agreed and gave us the scanners for free.
- 2) The bank continued our rebate program, where we can earn in the area of \$15-20,000 by having vendors agree to credit card payments. The program got changed to the point that the City did not qualify for rebates. We went to customer service they went to corporate and got the program amended, so the City now qualifies again for the rebates.
- 3) The bank collateralizes all City funds held at the bank. I was recently reviewing them and decided that the funds would be more appropriately collateralized through the FDIC, which I knew would be an expense to the bank. They agreed to change the collateral and within a week our collateral was upgraded to FDIC quality.

Fiscal Considerations: Almost all services have fee increases over time, but Associated Bank has agreed to maintain all, but one, fees offered in 2015. The lone fee change is related to FDIC fees charged to the bank by the Federal Government. This fee change will cost between \$40-\$50 per month.

Operational Considerations: With the amount of administrative time and expense involved with switching banks it is always great to have your existing bank maintain the line on expenses.

The just as important point, which cannot be measured, is the level of service provided. The finance employees will tell you that we cannot see how anybody could be more customer friendly and quick to remedy any banking issues that we encounter.

Requested Action: Recommend approval of extending our banking agreement with Associated Bank.

Dear Mr. Heilman,

Please allow this letter to summarize and update some of the material portions of the agreement between Associated Bank, N.A. and the City of Elkhorn.

<u>Term.</u> Commencing February 1, 2020 and ending on January 31, 2024, with an additional option to renew.

<u>Operational Requirements.</u> Bank shall perform the operations and provide the services as set forth in the proposal dated October 23, 2015.

<u>Earnings Credit.</u> An earnings credit ("Earnings Credit") shall be applied to monthly bank fees and shall offset Bank's fees. The Earnings Credit rate is indexed to the Federal Funds Rate plus 0.05% (currently at 1.80%) published under the "Money Rates" section in the Midwest Edition of the Wall Street Journal.

<u>Interest Rate.</u> Any funds on deposit in the analyzed accounts which are not used in the calculation of the Earnings Credit shall earn interest at a rate that is indexed to the Federal Funds Rate less 0.10% (currently at 1.65%) for the term of the agreement.

Money Market Rate. All Money Market accounts with an average daily balance of \$10,000 would earn an interest rate of 1.75% and would fluctuate with the market. If the average daily balance on a Money Market account is below \$10,000, the account would earn the standard money market rate at that time.

Treasury Management Pricing. See attached Associated Bank Pricing Proposal for updated pricing services.

<u>Collateralization.</u> Collateral will be provided on balances above current FDIC insurance limits and the State of Wisconsin Insurance Pool according to your investment policy at no additional costs. Joint custody collateral is provided in the City of Elkhorn's name held at the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston.

Proposal for Survey Services

Dear Jim,

Kapur & Associates, Inc. is pleased to submit this proposal for a boundary and topographic design survey pursuant to the Wisconsin State Administration Code AE – 7 standards. Containing approximately 7 acres, in the City of Elkhorn (Tax Parcel YV SE 00024), the project is located on East Seymour Court.

A title letter report is required for this tax parcel and can be acquired from a title company from usually around \$300 - \$500 per tax parcel (an estimate can be requested prior). This is to acquire all applicable deeds, uncover recorded easements, and encumbrances on the site to be developed.

SCOPE OF SERVICES:

The general scope of services for this proposal includes creating a Plat of Survey in accordance with pursuant to the Wisconsin State Administration Code AE – 7 standards. Including: setting vertical and horizontal survey control, collecting site plan topographic information (utilities (above and below ground as possible), buildings, fences, gravel, pavement, and trees), creating a legal description from information acquired from the title research and boundary field survey, setting property corner monumentation (setting new property corners if needed), creating a surface with 1 foot contours, showing all recorded easements, encroachments (if any) and rights of way in record.

The cost for the above described survey services is a lump sum fee of \$4,916.

This fee is determined based upon our understanding of the project as described in this proposal. Expansion or changes to the scope of work, performance time, or unanticipated site conditions may require a contract amendment.
