MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Reynolds presented Mike Riese, retired Public Works Crewman, with an award thanking him for his 13+ years of service to the City and its residents.

HUMAN RESOURCES

Community Service Officer Staffing Discussion

There are currently two CSO's working 28.5 hours a week each with a portion reimbursed by the school for their crossing guard duties. One of them obtained a full-time job and they want to keep her on but she is unable to work all the hours and they plan to hire someone to cover those hours and also fill in for vacations. No additional money will be needed for the position.

Recreation Director Vacancy Replacement

Administrator Tapson said he reviewed the position description and there is an emphasis on management. The position requires a four year college degree or equivalent experience. Staff will review the applications, select 4-6 applicants and then bring the applicants in for an interview and have a couple of Council members participate in the interview process. Administrator Tapson said the new director can evaluate where the department is and look into programs that overlap with school programs, such as swim lessons.

FINANCIAL AND JUDICIAL

"Final" Preliminary Budget Review Discussion

The levy increase is 2.3% which is about \$9-10 on a median value home. The Expenditure Restraint Program is preserved. The two new positions for DPW and Recreation are in the budget. The budget is scheduled to be released October 15th.

Recommendation to Approve Patrol Squad Vehicle Upfitting

Police Chief Christensen said he sent out quotes on Friday (it was the deadline) for the new squad vehicle and at this time it was unknown if he would receive the vehicle. Alderman McClory said the County sent out for quotes and were told they wouldn't get them. Police Chief Christensen said he would know in 2-3 weeks. He also said the new car that was already purchased is getting the radio and rest of the equipment installed, at state pricing for \$11,812.50 from General Communications. It is within the 2018 Budget.

Motion (McClory/Shiroda) to approve General Communications for \$11,812 for P.D. vehicle upfitting. Roll call vote: Boggs, yes; Young, yes; Dunwiddie, yes; McClory, yes. Motion carried.

PLAN COMMISSION

Recommendation to Approve Rezone for Wilson Farm Meats from M-2 to B-3 (Ordinance under New Business)

Mayor Reynolds said the Wilson property to the north next to the railroad tracks is the property to be rezoned.
