New candidates should file a Campaign Registration Statement as soon as intent to seek elective office is known and before funds are collected or spent. Candidates may begin circulating nomination papers on December 1, 2021. Signed nomination papers must be filed with the Clerk by 5 p.m. on Tuesday, January 4, 2022. The spring election will be held on April 5, 2022. If necessary, a primary election will be held on February 15, 2022. Contact the City Clerk with any questions on running for office.

HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE

Energy Services for Walworth County is now taking applications for home energy assistance. To qualify for assistance, households must have gross income for the three months immediately preceding the month of application that is at or below 60 percent of the state median income guidelines.

To apply, applicants must provide Social Security numbers for all members of the household, most recent energy bill, photo identification and written proof of household's gross income for the three months prior to the application.

SUMP PUMP AND CLEAR WATER DISCHARGE

Please be advised that an ordinance adjustment regarding sump pump discharge was in effect on April 1, 2020 (Ordinance Chapter 13.4.040). Summarized adjustments are as follows:

- All sump pumps shall be connected to existing City of Elkhorn storm sewers as long as said City systems are within or near the existing parcel's frontage and out of the roadway.
- Sump pumps not connected to a City of Elkhorn system (as allowed, as noted above) may discharge over hard surfaces from April 1st to November 1st; discharge to terraced areas (grass surfaces) is permitted year round.
- If sump pump discharge is determined to create a Public Nuisance by causing freezing or slippery conditions within public right-of-way then the nuisance shall be promptly and properly abated.
- Sump pump piping from a building or home to the City's storm sewer system shall be the responsibility of the property owner, including connection to the public sewer.

BE SURE TO PAY YOUR UTILITY BILL THIS WINTER

Just a reminder to continue to pay your utility bills throughout the winter months, so that a large utility bill on April 16th can be avoided. The bill does not go away, it just accumulates with penalties.

Elkhorn Light & Water will not offer a DPA to a residential customer who is a tenant if any of the following criteria applies:

- 1. The residential tenant has greater than \$100 of account arrearages that are more than 90 days past due.
- 2. The residential tenant has defaulted on a deferred payment agreement in the past 12 months.
- 3. The residential tenant is responsible for account arrearages that were placed on any property owner's tax bill in the utility's service territory in the past 24 months.
- 4. The residential tenant has a balance that accrued during the winter moratorium that is more than 80 days past due.

Anyone within any of the above categories will not be allowed to make a DPA in the future.

TRICK OR TREATING

Trick or treating in the City of Elkhorn will take place Sunday, October 31st from 5:00PM- 7:00PM. The following is a list of safety tips to ensure that your trick or treat experience is a fun, safe experience for both yourself and your children:

- Do not allow a child to go trick or treating alone. Be sure older children take a friend and an adult accompanies young children.
- Be sure to accompany young children to the door of every house they approach.
- Children should be cautioned to NOT to enter any home without permission from their guardian.
- Encourage carrying a glow stick or wearing reflective clothing. Facial masks should allow easy breathing. All costumes and masks should be clearly marked as flame resistant.
- Parents should inspect all treats and dispose of anything that seems to have been tampered with, has been opened, or is not wrapped.

- Leaves, vegetables, and grass clippings.
- Yard/garden debris and brush including clean, woody vegetative material no greater than 12 inches in diameter.
- Tree limbs and branches no greater than 12 inches in diameter and 12 feet in length.
- 30 gallon paper bags or dry cardboard boxes no larger than 3' x 3'.
- NO stumps, roots or shrubs with intact root balls.
- NO Plastic bags!

BURNING ORDINANCE

The city's ordinance, Chapter 5.17 titled Outdoor Fires, was updated. One of the changes made to the ordinance includes allowing campfires, by permit, 12 months of the year, rather than just a portion of the year (permit applications can be obtained at City Hall). The biggest change to the ordinance is banning open burning. Residents may no longer burn leaves at any time. Officials chose to coordinate the banning of leaf burning with the expansion of yard waste dropoff hours at the new public works building.

KEEP DEBRIS OFF THE STREET

The city of Elkhorn is a permitted MS4 community as defined by the State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR). With that in mind, storm water from Elkhorn, which travels to the Rock River and Upper Fox River, is now being monitored by the WDNR. In order to stay compliant and protect the environment, we maintain ordinances and policies to keep grass, dirt, branches, yard waste and garbage off the street. This prevents said debris from clogging inlets and ending up in our tributaries. We ask that you do your part and follow said policies and ordinances as outlined within this notice and as found on our website.

2021 FALL BRUSH COLLECTION

TUESDAY - FRIDAY:

East of Wisconsin St.: Weeks of October 11 & October 25 West of Wisconsin St.: Weeks of October 18 & November 1

RESIDENT GUIDELINES:

- No vines, rakings or roots.
- Do NOT co-mingle leaves with brush.
- Place cut endes, no larger than 6 inches in diameter or 12 feet in length, facing direction of traveling traffic.

All brush must be placed on the terrace by 7:00 a.m. on Tuesday of your brush collection week. Public Works personnel will begin the route on Tuesday morning and will collect properly disposed of brush sometime during your scheduled week. Please do not place brush out after Public Works personnel have gone by, they will only go through the route once during the week. Parked cars must not block brush piles. If you hire a contractor for tree work, the contractor must take all debris.


Fall Leaf Collection begins the week of October 11- October 15 (Monday-Friday) and ends the week of November 15-November 19 (Monday-Friday). The City is divided into 5 color coded sections; each section has an assigned week day for leaf collection. Waste Management is contracted to conduct leaf collection.

LEAVES WILL ONLY BE COLLECTED DURING YOUR LEAF COLLECTION DAY.

- Rake leaves into the street at least 12 inches away from the curb to allow storm water to pass. Leaves will be picked up off of the street.
- Do NOT place leaves sooner than the Saturday prior to your pickup week.
- Leaves MUST be ready for colleciton no later than 7:00 a.m. of the scheduled pickup day.
- Do NOT combine brush with leaves or place leaves in bags or boxes.

REFUSE AND RECYCLING

Waste Management is contracted by the City of Elkhorn to be the provider of residential trash and recycling services for the community. Refuse will continue to be picked up weekly on your scheduled day of Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday. See map on page 8 for your pick-up day.

KEEP IN MIND:

Trash and Recycle Carts

Please use the trash cart for acceptable residential waste materials only and your recycle cart for recycling materials. Nothing outside the carts will be collected. Please do not overstuff carts. Carts may not be serviced if overfilled to point at which lid cannot be closed. Recycling will be collected every other week on the same day as your trash collection. No service is provided on holidays. (See schedule to the right.)

Cart Placement

All carts should be placed at the curb with the handles facing the house. Containers need to be at least 3 feet away from mailboxes, other containers, and any other fixed object.

Bulk Pickup

Requests for Bulk Pickups can be made by calling Waste Management Customer Service at (888) 960-0008, or by emailing wmeservice@wm.com. State that you are a City of Elkhorn resident. One bulk item pickup request can be made per week. There is a limit of 2 bulk items and/or appliances per week and a weight limit of 175 lbs per item. No charge is assessed for bulk item pickup.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTABLE IN TRASH CARTS:

Hazardous household waste, construction debris, tires, liquid waste, yard waste, aeresol cans, batteries, electronics, dead animals, fertilizers, compressd air cylinders.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTABLE IN RECYCLING CARTS:

All of the above plus food waste, plastic bags, film, foam cups/containers, needles.



WINTER PARKING REGULATIONS

The parking or leaving of any vehicle on any street in the City is prohibited when the National Weather Service has issued any of the following winter storm messages in effect for our area: winter weather advisory, winter storm warning or blizzard warning. These parking restrictions will remain in effect for a period of 12 hours after the expiration of the winter storm message. Failure to comply may result in the removal of any vehicle parked in violation of this, and the vehicle owner shall be responsible for the cost of towing, storage and any other charges in connection with its removal in addition to the penalties set forth in the city ordinance.



CLEARING HYDRANTS

In the event of a fire emergency during the winter, could firefighters find the hydrant near your home?

The City of Elkhorn encourages residents to be aware of the fire hydrants near their home and keep snow shoveled away from it during the winter season. We may not have much snowfall in the coming months, but questions brought to the Common Council raised concern. Clear a path approximately 3 feet around the hydrant. This gives the fire department room to work with this hydrant should the need arise. Please consider helping a neighbor who is elderly or has a medical condition by shoveling out a hydrant in front of their home. This act of kindness will benefit the entire neighborhood. Water is the principal agent used by the Fire Department to control and extinguish fires. Delays in locating and hooking-up to a fire hydrant can seriously hamper a fire suppression operation, raising the risk of injury and possibly resulting in additional property damage.

WINTER SIDEWALK CLEARING

A reminder to keep sidewalks safe this winter. Per the Elkhorn Municipal Code, the entire width of the sidewalk needs to be cleared of all accumulated snow and/or ice within 24 hours of the time that the snow or ice ceases to accumulate. If ice has accumulated, the owner is required to sprinkle the sidewalk with necessary material to accelerate melting or prevent slipping. Owners of property with sidewalks on two intersecting streets are required to remove snow and ice from the sidewalks of both streets, including the area bordering the crosswalk and the curb ramp. Do not plow, push, shovel or throw snow or ice onto any public streets, alley, sidewalk or public lands dedicated to public use except for parcels or lots where buildings are constructed within 5 feet of the street right-of-way and the sidewalks exist from the City right-of-way to the curb line. In such instances, it is permitted to deposit, in a nonhazardous manner, snow and ice from their sidewalks only onto public streets. If the City has to remove the snow and/or ice, the property owner will be charged without prior notice.

CANCELLATION

Updates are posted to Facebook: Elkhorn Recreation Department. We will do our best to update this communication method as soon as possible. Please check them frequently. We reserve the right to cancel any activity or program.

MINIMUM ENROLLMENT

All programs are subject to cancellation if minimum enrollment is not met. When this is the case, pre-registered participants will be contacted and be offered a refund or credit on account. We make every effort to avoid cancellations.

CODE OF CONDUCT

All instructors, participants, and guardians are expected at all times to be positive and respectful to all involved. They must be supportive and proactive in all situations, and may otherwise be asked to leave the activity or session.

Register as soon as possible so an activity is not cancelled due to low enrollment.

DEADLINES

NOTHING KILLS A PROGRAM QUICKER than everyone waiting until the last minute to register. Please REGISTER IN ADVANCE OF THE DEADLINE! At some point, we must determine if enrollment is sufficient to hold the activity. Your cooperation will assist us in providing the best organization and administration of recreation programs.

PROGRAM FEES

Program fees are due at the time of registration. Failure to make payment on outstanding fees may result in inability to participate in the program. All fees are subject to change.

ACTIVITY CHANGES

Due to circumstances beyond our control, some activities may require time or location changes. All participants will be notified, when possible.

REFUND

All participants are only eligible for a 50% refund after payment is processed for all programs/activities. No refunds for any reason will be given after the program started. A prorated refund may be granted only for medical or unavoidable circumstances, on or after the activity start date. Some type of proof will be required in writing prior to the refund. If the Recreation Department cancels or reschedules a program due to insufficient registration numbers, a transfer or refund will be granted. No refunds will be granted to adult team programs once the league has started, unless cancelled by the Recreation Department. No refunds will be issued for day trips or craft classes because the Recreation Department is responsible for full payment of enrollment totals. No refunds will be given if you are unable to attend a make-up date or cancellation date for all programs.





A. Sunset Park- Elkhorn's premier park! This is the location of our brand new state of the art Sunset Pool as well as the historic Elkhorn Band Shell. The park offers a wide array of recreational activities including: 4 new baseball/softball fields, new swimming pool, picnic areas, 2 basketball courts and 2 playgrounds. The ADA park is next to the Lions Den and is wheelchair accessible. The Lions Den is our largest and nicest pavilion and available to rent for your private parties. There are bathrooms at this pavilion as well. Location: 200 Devendorf Street.

B. Temlitz Park- A nature resource park. The walking path is a great place to enjoy bird watching or a relaxing walk. Location: At the end of Greenfield Street.

C. Broad Street Park- This is a neighborhood park where kids can play on the playground or in the sand. Location: Corner of North Broad Street and Second Avenue.

D. Tasch Park- It offers a NEW playground and t-ball field, basketball courts and recreational open space. Location: 12 1st Ave.

E. Pocket Park- It is perfect to stop and enjoy your coffee or meet a friend. This park is small in nature but able to host the right event if planned appropriately and is the home-base for Oktoberfest every year. Location: N. Wisconsin Street across from the downtown square between buildings.


F. Harris Park- Consists of two baseball and one softball field. The softball field is called Red, and baseball fields are called the Varsity and Colt fields. Harris Park has a concession stand, a pavilion with bathrooms and a playground area, as well basketball hoops that are right next to the school. Night Under the Lights is held at Harris Park in June. Location: Between Jackson Elementary and Elkhorn Area High School off of Wright Street.

G. White River Bike Trail- Hwy H, just south of Gateway Technical college. This multi-use 12 mile crushed limestone trail follows a former railroad bed. It connects Elkhorn to Burlington. See page 25.

H. Babe Mann Park- Elkhorn's largest park sprawling over 34 acres surrounding Elkhorn Lake. Canoeing and fishing are allowed. Swimming is prohibited. **The covered pavilion is under rennovation and will not be available to rent.** Bathrooms, picnic tables, and benches are provided. A one-mile trail surrounds the lake for cross-country skiing, hiking, walking/jogging or biking. Location: City Industrial Park, 900 Proctor Drive.

I. Rotary Park-Three soccer fields, a concession stand, playground and picnic area. Location: O'Connor Drive off of Hwy 67.

J. Market Street Park- Located in Harvest Pointe Subdivision. This park is ADA accessible & features play equipment, walking paths and a shelter. Location: Corner of Market St. and Heather Dr.



K. Veterans Park- Plenty of shade trees and a few picnic tables. Location: Downtown on the square.


