## ADVANCED METERING

Elkhorn has begun the process of transitioning from manual meters to advanced meters. The advanced meters will enable our staff to provide proactive customer service and allow faster detection of service related problems such as electric outages, power quality issues, and water leaks. So far, we have installed approximately 1,400 electric meters. See our website www.cityofelkhorn.org for Frequently Asked Questions.

A letter will be mailed letting you know when we will be in your area and giving you more information about advanced metering. You do not have to be present when we change the electric meter but you will need to make an appointment to install a water meter.

Due to Covid and supply issues, there has been a delay in getting water meters. Once we receive the water meters in house, we will proceed in changing the water meters out.

#### **KEEP DEBRIS OFF THE STREET**

The city of Elkhorn is a permitted MS4 community as defined by the State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR). With that in mind, storm water from Elkhorn, which travels to the Rock River and Upper Fox River, is now being monitored by the WDNR. In order to stay compliant and protect the environment, we maintain ordinances and policies to keep grass, dirt, branches, yard waste and garbage off the street. This prevents said debris from clogging inlets and ending up in our tributaries. We ask that you do your part and follow said policies and ordinances as outlined within this notice and as found on our website.

#### **BURNING ORDINANCE**

The city's ordinance, Chapter 5.17 titled *Outdoor Fires*, was updated. One of the changes made to the ordinance includes allowing campfires, by permit, 12 months of the year, rather than just a portion of the year (permit applications can be obtained at City Hall). The biggest change to the ordinance is banning open burning. **Residents may no longer burn leaves at any time.** Officials chose to coordinate the banning of leaf burning with the expansion of yard waste drop-off hours at the new public works building.

## **REFUSE AND RECYCLING**

Waste Management is contracted by the City of Elkhorn to be the provider of residential trash and recycling services for the community. Refuse will continue to be picked up weekly on your scheduled day of Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday. See map on the next page for your pick-up day.

#### **KEEP IN MIND:**

#### **Trash and Recycle Carts**

Please use the trash cart for acceptable residential waste materials only and your recycle cart for recycling materials. Nothing outside the carts will be collected. Please do not overstuff carts. Carts may not be serviced if overfilled to point at which lid cannot be closed. Recycling will be collected every other week on the same day as your trash collection. No service is provided on holidays. (See schedule to the right.)

#### **Cart Placement**

All carts should be placed at the curb with the handles facing the house. Containers need to be at least 3 feet away from mailboxes, other containers, and any other fixed object.

#### **Bulk Pickup**

Requests for Bulk Pickups can be made by calling Waste Management Customer Service at (888) 960-0008, or by emailing wmeservice@wm.com. State that you are a City of Elkhorn resident. One bulk item pickup request can be made per week. There is a limit of 2 bulk items and/or appliances per week and a weight limit of 175 lbs per item. No charge is assessed for bulk item pickup.

#### ITEMS NOT ACCEPTABLE IN TRASH CARTS:

Hazardous household waste, construction debris, tires, liquid waste, yard waste, aeresol cans, batteries, electronics, dead animals, fertilizers, compressd air cylinders.

#### ITEMS NOT ACCEPTABLE IN RECYCLING CARTS:







## KNOW BEFORE YOU ENROLL

#### RESIDENCY

A person is considered a resident if the citizen resides within the corporate boundaries of the City of Elkhorn, not the school district or postal city. NOTE: Residents in the Elkhorn Area School District will be considered residents for all programs held at a school facility. A person is NOT considered a resident if any of the following are true: A City of Elkhorn business owner that lives outside the City of Elkhorn limits. Residence outside the City of Elkhorn limits: Town of Lafayette, Town of Geneva, Town of Delavan, Town of Sugar Creek. Cannot provide proof of residency when registering for programs.

## CANCELLATION

Updates are posted to Facebook: Elkhorn Recreation Department. We will do our best to update this communication method as soon as possible. Please check them frequently. We reserve the right to cancel any activity or program.

#### MINIMUM ENROLLMENT

All programs are subject to cancellation if minimum enrollment is not met. When this is the case, pre-registered participants will be contacted and be offered a refund or credit on account. We make every effort to avoid cancellations.

## CODE OF CONDUCT

All instructors, participants, and guardians are expected at all times to be positive and respectful to all involved. They must be supportive and proactive in all situations, and may otherwise be asked to leave the activity or session.

Register as soon as possible so an activity is not cancelled due to low enrollment.

#### DEADLINES

NOTHING KILLS A PROGRAM QUICKER than everyone waiting until the last minute to register. Please **REGISTER IN ADVANCE OF THE DEADLINE!** At some point, we must determine if enrollment is sufficient to hold the activity. Your cooperation will assist us in providing the best organization and administration of recreation programs.

### **PROGRAM FEES**

Program fees are due at the time of registration. Failure to make payment on outstanding fees may result in inability to participate in the program. All fees are subject to change.

## ACTIVITY CHANGES

Due to circumstances beyond our control, some activities may require time or location changes. All participants will be notified, when possible.

#### REFUND

- No refunds will be issued after the start of the program.

- A full refund will be issued only if the Recreation Department cancels a program. Cancellations occur when a program does not meet the minimum registration requirements. The City reserves the right to cancel or combine any program or class due to insufficient registration or for other reasons that would prevent the department from providing a quality activity.

- A 50% refund will be granted if notice is given within the two weeks prior of program start date.

- A prorated refund may be granted only for medical or unavoidable circumstances, on or after the activity start date.

- Refunds will not be issued for individual classes missed or vacations. Missed classes will not be made-up nor will the participants attend any other class in its place.

We use pictures of participants in brochures and displays to inform others of our recreational opportunities. We will not identify individuals by name. If you do not want a photo taken, please tell the photographer and or instructor.

## SUNSET POOL POLICIES

MEMBERSHIPS: Family Memberships are for parents and children living in the same household. Family passes do not include nannies, babysitters, nurses, caregivers, cousins, nieces, nephews or out of town guests. If grandparents would like to take the place of parent(s) – this is allowable under certain circumstances and requests must be made in person at the recreation center. A \$25 fee will be issued if any changes to a membership are made after the purchase is complete (adding or replacing a member, or any other changes,...). No refund will be issued if the membership was not used or was rarely used.

BABYSITTER PASS: \$25 Resident/ \$40 Nonresident: A babysitter pass may only be purchased by family membership owners and is issued in a punch-card form. The pass can be used by multiple babysitters but must be used when with children of the family who purchased card. 10 punches will be issued. Babysitter must be 12 & up.

SUPERVISION: Every child age 6 or under must be within arms reach of an adult or guardian at all times. Our lifeguards are trained with safety as the highest importance for every guest, but an extra set of eyes on children in or near the water is a bonus.

SWIM DIAPERS: All guest who are not potty trained must wear a swim diaper. They are available at the front desk for \$1.

WEATHER: Please check the weather before you come to the pool. If the air temperature is 65° or less, we do not open or could close early. If we need to close because of lightening or thunder, the wait period is 30 minutes from the last thunder. If the weather does not get better, we will issue you a hand stamp and you may return later. If you cannot return later and the storm is unexpected and you had just arrived at pool within the last hour, a day pass will be issued in form of a coupon. No cash refunds will be given.

SWIM TESTS: Anyone less than 12 years old will need to pass the swim test to go down the drop-slide.

- Swim tests will be held every hour on the hour.
- Swim tests to receive a wristband will be done by a certified lifeguard.
- If you pass the swim test you will receive a free wristband to keep.
- If you lose your wristband, a new one can be purchased for \$1 at the front desk.

LOCKER ROOMS: Please bring your own padlock if you wish to lock your items in a locker. We are not responsible for any stolen items. There is a lost and found at the front desk.

LOUNGERS, CHAIRS, & TABLES: If you or your children are not going to use a chair, please do not put your items on numerous chairs. Items may be placed in the grass or in a locker or cubby.

BEHAVIOR: At all times, children and adults are expected to act respectful to each other and staff. If a patron is not following policy, they will be warned. If action further warrants, they may be asked to leave without getting hand stamped. If action is repeated, they may not be able to return for a period of time or all summer long.

CONCESSIONS: Per WI state law, no coolers, nor food of any kind is allowed into the facility. We can however stamp your hand if you wish to leave and return, as there are picnic benches outside the pool gate. Water is the only item that may be brought into the facility in a clear container. If you have a special diet concern, please talk to the pool manager. If you are unhappy with our concessions at any time, please ask to speak to our pool manager. No drinks or food in the pool or on the pool edge.

FLOTATION DEVICES: No floatation devices are allowed on any day and this includes water wings, unless attached to a belt or vest that is coast guard approved, eg. Puddle Jumper. Any vest that is approved should always say on the inside label "coast guard approved" or "USCG." Approved life vests are available to borrow at the front desk.

JUST WATCHING? If you enter the facility, you must pay the admission fee, even if you are not swimming. If your children or grandchildren are above the age of 10 and you do not want to pay but still want to watch them, there are benches outside the fence for your relaxation. If you are picking a child up, just let staff know your child's name and we will announce it!

LARGE GROUPS: Organized large groups must prearrange their visits with staff 2 weeks in advance. All camps, daycares and groups must preregister days and specific times. Call the pool manager for times and availability. Groups will pay the daily admission per person upon arrival.

TOBACCO USAGE/VAPE PENS: Vape pens, chewing tobacco, cigarettes are not allowed in the facility or parking lot.

DIVING: Hop-dives, front flips, twists and the cannonball will be allowed. Back flips are not allowed due to risk of injury.





#### **ON-GOING TRAINING**

Did you know that our lifeguards continue their training throughout the summer with in-service hours? Along with this practice, we will be performing drop tests with body silhouettes in the pool during open swim hours. If you are there when one of these (or any emergency) is taking place, please stay back and allow the guards to do their jobs.

#### QUESTIONS OR CONCERNS?

Safety is always our number one priority. If you have an questions or concerns, please go to the pool's main office and ask to speak with a manager. Please do not engage the on-duty lifeguards, unless it is an emergency.





A. Sunset Park- Elkhorn's premier park! This is the location of our brand new state of the art Sunset Pool as well as the historic Elkhorn Band Shell. The park offers a wide array of recreational activities including: 4 new baseball/softball fields, new swimming pool, picnic areas, 2 basketball courts and 2 playgrounds. The ADA park is next to the Lions Den and is wheelchair accessible. The Lions Den is our largest and nicest pavilion and available to rent for your private parties. There are bathrooms at this pavilion as well. Location: 200 Devendorf Street.

B. Temlitz Park- A nature resource park. The walking path is a great place to enjoy bird watching or a relaxing walk. Location: At the end of Greenfield Street.

C. Broad Street Park- This is a neighborhood park where kids can play on the playground or in the sand. Location: Corner of North Broad Street and Second Avenue.

D. Tasch Park- It offers a NEW playground and t-ball field, basketball courts and recreational open space. Location: 12 1st Ave.

E. Pocket Park- It is perfect to stop and enjoy your coffee or meet a friend. This park is small in nature but able to host the right event if planned appropriately and is the home-base for Oktoberfest every year. Location: N. Wisconsin Street across from the downtown square between buildings.



G. White River Bike Trail- Hwy H, just south of Gateway Technical college. This multi-use 12 mile crushed limestone trail follows a former railroad bed. It connects Elkhorn to Burlington. See page 25.

H. Babe Mann Park- Elkhorn's largest park sprawling over 34 acres surrounding Elkhorn Lake. Canoeing and fishing are allowed. Swimming is prohibited. **The covered pavilion is under rennovation and will not be available to rent.** Bathrooms, picnic tables, and benches are provided. A one-mile trail surrounds the lake for cross-country skiing, hiking, walking/jogging or biking. Location: City Industrial Park, 900 Proctor Drive.

I. Rotary Park- Three soccer fields, a concession stand, playground and picnic area. Location: O'Connor Drive off of Hwy 67.

J. Market Street Park- Located in Harvest Pointe Subdivision. This park is ADA accessible & features play equipment, walking paths and a shelter. Location: Corner of Market St. and Heather Dr.



K. Veterans Park- Plenty of shade trees and a few picnic tables. Location: Downtown on the square.
